A New Metropolitan Bio

Metropolitan Borys Gudziak was born November 24, 1960 to Jaroslawa and Alexander Gudziak in Syracuse, NY. His parents, both <u>Ukrainian Greek Catholics</u>, had come to New York from western Ukraine following WWII. The Gudziaks were the parents of two sons, Borys and Marko. After completing his pre-university studies at Christian Brothers Academy, he graduated from <u>Syracuse University</u>, obtaining a dual degree in philosophy and biology

in 1980. He entered the College of Saint Sophia in Rome where, as a student of the Lviv Archeparchy under Cardinal Josyf Slipyj, he attended the Pontifical Urban University. In 1983, he graduated in theology and began doctoral studies in an interdepartmental program of Slavic and Byzantine Cultural History at Harvard University, where he received his Ph.D. in 1992. From October 1994 until July 1995 he attended the Pontifical Oriental Institute.

In 1992, he moved permanently to Lviv, where he founded the Institute of Church History (ISC), becoming its director until October 2002. In 1993 he was appointed chairman of the Commission for the Renewal of the Lviv Theological Academy by Archbishop Myroslav Ivan Lubachivsky. From 1995 until 2000 he served as vice rector of the Lviv Theological Academy, then as rector from 2000 to 2002. In that year, Gudziak became rector of the Ukrainian Catholic University (founded on the basis of the academy), and later its president.

He was <u>ordained</u> on November 26, 1998 in the <u>Cathedral of St. George in Lviv</u> by <u>Bishop Sofron Mudry</u>, O.S.B.M. and <u>incardinated</u> in the Major Archeparchy of Lviv of the Ukrainians. He is the author of over 50 studies on the history of the Church, theological training and on different topics of cultural relevance.

On July 21, 2012, Borys Gudziak was appointed apostolic exarch for the Ukrainian faithful of the Byzantine rite in France, and at the same time appointed <u>Titular Bishop</u> of *Carcabia*. He was ordained a bishop on August 26, 2012 and installed in a <u>Divine Liturgy</u> on December 2, 2012.

On February 18, 2019, the Vatican Information Service announced that the Holy Father had appointed Most Rev. Borys Gudziak as <u>Archeparch of Philadelphia</u> for Ukrainians and Metropolitan for the Ukrainian Catholic Church in USA. He was installed on June 4, 2019.
