

Safety Measures in Church

1. The church will be cleaned/sanitized before each service when the public may be present, especially areas that are commonly touched (railings, doors, backs of pews, etc.). Please keep the churches well ventilated by opening windows or by turning on air-conditioner.
2. Social distancing of 6 feet will be maintained, people are encouraged to wear face masks and gloves, while seating or standing in the pews – between non-family member
3. Veneration of icons, etc. should be done without touching or kissing them.
4. There should be no social gatherings after the services.
5. Parishioners should be reminded that if they are not feeling well that they should stay at home and reminded that they are not bound by the Sunday obligation if they are ill.
6. The streaming of the Divine Liturgy will continue for those who cannot make it to church every Sunday at 10AM on YouTube and FaceBook of *Catholic Explorer*. Please, subscribe and especially like each video, so that we can reach more and more people.
7. **For Communion, we will resume our communion line, while keeping 6' distance from each other.**
8. Collection baskets will be left in designated places so that parishioners may leave their offerings without passing around baskets.
9. Sacrament of Penance will be administered in safe space with keeping social distance.
10. Celebration of baptisms, weddings and funerals are allowed if all precautions listed above are observed.
