In this sense, we can say that the goal of the Christian life is complete unity with God in Heaven for all eternity.

The essence of heaven is oneness with God’s will, the oneness of will and Truth. Earth becomes “heaven” when and insofar as God’s will is done There; and it is merely “earth,” the opposite of heaven, when and insofar As it withdraws from the will of God.

With their sights on eternal life in Heaven, Christians strive to do the will of God on earth, thus cooperating with him in establishing the kingdom of Heaven on earth. In communion with God and following his moral law, a Christian shares in the joy of the life to come and eternal life in Heaven.
